Kit Carson (1809 – 1868) The epitome of the American West


- Born in KY, lived in MO, (Howard County)
- By Age 8 he must help provide for his family
- Spoke six languages but could not read or write
- Acute, personable, resourceful, & DECISIVE
- Became trusted friends of many... Freemont, Kearny, Polk, and later Sherman
- Married twice, 1st wife died in childbirth, with his 2nd for 40 years. Died one month after her.
- His knowledge of and work with the Navaho was a double-edged sword - the infamous Long Walk




