
#### Cheered for Pop Fly.




#### Eberhard Anheuser 1806-1880

Adolphus Busch was born in Germany, state of Hesse, in 1839, the 21<sup>st</sup> of 22 children. Busch came to New York in 1861 when he was 18 with his three older brothers. Eberhard Anheuser had helped found a brewing company in 1853 called the Bavarian Brewing Company. It struggled, later named Anheuser Brewing Co.


Adolphus went to work for Mr. Anheuser, got sweet on his daughter, Lily, and married her. Before long he was co-owner of the brewing company and renamed it Anheuser-Busch.


