The LIR scholarship, in the amount of \$2500.00 will be awarded annually to a Lincoln University undergraduate student of any major.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Missouri High School Graduate or MO HS Equivalency Certificate
- Current Status as of December 31,2023: Sophomore (30-59 sem. credit hrs.) or Junior (60-89 sem. credit hrs.)
- GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Financial need

Applicants should submit the scholarship application, a resume with evidence of community/campus involvement, an **unofficial** transcript, and a one-page essay addressing educational goals and how the scholarship will assist with achieving those goals.

The scholarship recipient will be selected and notified in May. Upon notification of award, the recipient must forward an official transcript to Graduate and Extended Studies. The award will be applied to the upcoming fall semester and will be sent directly to Lincoln University student accounts and applied to the recipient's account. The recipient is strongly encouraged to attend the LIR summer general meeting held on July 17, 2024
