#### From The LIR President:

Our July general membership meeting went well and was attended by about 165 members. Thanks to our Hospitality and Membership and Marketing Committees for all their efforts to make this annual event so successful!

Our next opportunity to all get together will occur on Wednesday, December 6th at our annual LIR Holiday Social. Details are available elsewhere in this newsletter.

Several questions have been raised regarding the amount of money we have available to be invested in Certificates of Deposit. We need to have money available for several reasons, including to prepare for unforeseen events. The recent COVID experience is a good example. We lost over 100 members, and our available money to invest declined by over 20%.

The LIR Board has selected our officers for 2024. Cindy Stephens, our current Vice President, will become our new president. Cindy graduated from high school in Northeast Missouri and earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing from what is now Truman State University. She also earned a Master of Science degree in Nursing from the University of Missouri. Most of her nursing career was spent as a teacher. #### **CURRICULUM COMMITTEE UPDATES**

The following are classes the Curriculum Committee has planned for Winter/Spring 2024:

**Cold War Aftermath - Promise of a New World Order** — The Cold War ended with the fall of the Berlin Wall. What followed was both promise and disappointment.

**Movies - More Than The 3 R's** — Movies about teachers who taught more than <u>Reading</u>, <u>Riting</u> and <u>Rithmetic!</u> Featured movies will be: Dead Poet's Society, Mr. Holland's Opus, Freedom Writers, and The Marva Collins Story.

**Oral Histories** — Dr. Sean Rost, State Historical Society of Missouri, will tell us about the importance of oral histories, and the methods for doing so. Donna Deetz, president of the Historic City of Jefferson, will share HCJ's role in preserving oral histories.

**A Missouri Family's Summer in Mozambique** — Dr. Brian Norris (and his family!) will share tales of their adventures in Mozambique, where Dr. Norris conducted research on local governments.

The Top 7 Things You Should Know About Wills and Trusts — This is a repeat of a well-received program given in February 2023. LIR member and retired attorney Steve Newman will give an overview, followed by presentations from Central Bank and Hawthorne Bank trust administrators.

**Nutrition and Longevity** — Dr. Dianna Richardson will delve into the science of nutrition and its profound impact on aging and well-being.

**Memorials of the Dead: Perspectives on Mummification** — Join Dr. Christine E. Boston as she discusses mummies, mummification practices, and what we can learn culturally and scientifically from the study of the dead.

**Show-Me Beekeepers Association** — Gail Severance and Adam Benne will illustrate the essential skills and knowledge to become a successful beekeeper.

**Did You Know? "Black Wall Street"** — We'll examine the conditions that made it possible for such a phenomenal occurrence.

**Artificial Intelligence** — Discover how Artificial Intelligence is revolutionizing education, healthcare, finance, and technology.

**Famous Missourians, Chapter 4** — Yes, there are definitely more famous Missourians!

**Technology: Video Calling** — Learn the essential skills and techniques for phone calls (chatting with your grandchildren!), seamless online meetings, and virtual collaborations.

"Forgotten Shadows" - MSP — Mark Schreiber will talk about his book, "Forgotten Shadows," published in 2023. It is a visual exploration of the Missouri State Penitentiary (MSP) as it evolved from the 19th to the 21st century.

**Reading Nonfiction** — If you've ever read a newspaper or magazine, you've read nonfiction (although it may not seem like it)! Come join with members of our LIR Book Club to find out what kind of nonfiction they enjoy reading.

**Memories of Life During World War II** — World War II wasn't just battles. Rationing, censoring, bombing, victory gardens, V-mail, music — life at home was changed. Sharing memories before we forget.

**Eyes On the Move - Mexico** — Grab your sombrero and journey with the El Puente staff. They will explore Mexico, from ancient times to the present.

**Eating Up Missouri!** — A look at foods and foodways traditions connecting the people of Missouri, presented by Suzanne Corbell, an award-winning writer, food historian and foodways interpreter.

Your LIR Educational Travel Committee is hard at work planning some new opportunities for our next travel session! Here's what we have at this time.

**February 17**—*Gilligan's Island, The Musical:* Jefferson City's Capital City Productions presents the musical version of the iconic 1960's TV comedy show. It's fun, wacky, and entertaining.

**March 19—***Independence:* Tour the newly renovated Truman Library and Museum, see the town by covered wagon, and much more!

**April 30-May 1**—*Mastodons, Murder and Mile-High Pie:* Explore the Kimmswick area featuring visits to Grant's Farm, the Anheuser Estate and Home, a murder-mystery theater performance, Mastodon State Historic Site, and great pie at the Blue Owl Restaurant.

## **CLUBS YOU MAY WANT TO TRY**

Many members of Learning in Retirement are more interested in playing games with other members than in anything else. We have a number of clubs in LIR, and there's no additional cost. You might want to check out these two.

#### **Pinochle**

Pinochle (pronounced pea-nukkle) is a card game. Our purpose and goal is to meet with and enjoy the game with others, while benefiting not only from the mental exercise of the game, but also the social interactions. Anyone who has never played (or has not played recently) is taken underwing and taught or refreshed. Pinochle is played with three or more players; ideally four players per team.



#### Pitch

Let's play pitch! The Pitch Club gets together two times a month to have a good time, make friends, and keep the brains working with the great game of 10-point pitch. The game itself is one of strategy and luck.

Each player bids on his hand, based on number of cards in a suit and the number of points each is worth. It helps if your partner has some cards in the same suit. While the game itself makes you think, it is not so complex that you can't enjoy each other's company.

We pitch players enjoy talking and laughing as we play. So, when we say, "Let's play pitch", we mean let's have fun.
