Following lunch we visit <u>Crystal Bridges Art Museum</u>; this collection was amassed by Alice Walton to bring American Art to the heartland. A special exhibit by Norman Rockwell is included on our tour. The beautiful grounds are part of the total experience!

After a full day we'll check in at Comfort Suites for a two night stay. This evening we are treated to a managers' reception in the lobby or, if you prefer, you may find a restaurant nearby.

Next morning we're off to visit the <u>first home of Bill and</u> <u>Hillary Clinton</u> in Fayetteville followed by a guided tour of the <u>RFID Research Center</u>. This center is one of the world's preminent retail developing sites using amazing technology. We lunch at **Mermaids** in Fayetteville.

Following our lunch break, we visit **Drake Field Air Museum** where there are many displays of the history of Arkansas aviation from the 1920's through WWII and to the jet age. The wood hanger housing the museum was the former headquarters for an aviation training post during WWII.

A Day in Pulaski and Phelps Counties Fort Leonard Wood – St. James May 16, 2013

We start our day traveling to the Pulaski County Tourism Bureau in St. Robert's for a rest stop and to enjoy complimentary snacks while we browse through the Visitors Center. From there we travel to nearby Fort Leonard Wood Military Base which was constructed in the late 1940's. The post has become renowned for state-of-the-art training and support of national defense, and has served as the launching point for millions of military careers. It is home to the Engineer, Chemical and Military Police Corps Training Schools as well as personnel from all branches of the U.S. Military. While there we meet our military tour guide for the day, attend a graduation ceremony, lunch in the main dining hall and tour the Mahaffey Museum Complex.

Leaving the base around 3:00 p.m., we travel to St. James to the first ever **Vacuum Cleaner Museum** located on Historic Route 66. Yes, vacuums...everybody has one but do we know much about them? That's what we'll find out! After being "sucked in" to the vacuum tour, we cross the street and make a visit to St. James Winery for wine tasting and appetizers. Thomas Hart Benton Tour July 18, 2013

Tour the <u>Thomas Hart Benton Home</u> as if he and his wife Rita may step into a room at any minute. The furniture, appliances, books, clothes and many other items remain as the Benton's left them. Behind the home, the carriage house became Benton's Studio; easels, paints, pictures, and other items of his trade lay virtually untouched since last used by the artist.

Rita Benton purchased the home in 1939 and it remained their Missouri residence during the next four decades. After Rita died ten weeks after her husband in 1975, the residence became the property of the state of Missouri. Both of the middle aged Benton children had established their lives away from the Kansas City area and had no desire to retain the site.

After touring the home and studio we will travel a short distance to **Winstead's** on the Plaza for lunch, on your own. This is basically a 1950's hamburger/ice cream shop. The décor remains from that period and the food is inexpensive. Hamburgers, fries and onion rings are prepared as they were before the franchising of our meals; your food will not come from under a heating lamp. Usually, one never "has room" to try their famous ice cream deserts.

We then travel a few blocks to the <u>Nelson-Atkins Museum of</u>
<u>Art</u>, one of the best art museums in the U.S. with a number of important works. The gallery has the most extensive collection of Benton's works, including some of the most important (and controversial; what's a Benton work if not controversial?), canvases. Traveling with us as our tour guide will be Dan Herman.
